

MINNESOTA STATE UNIVERSITY, MANKATO 2003-2004 FACULTY IMPROVEMENT GRANT APPLICATION

Purpose of Grant

Description of activity

1. Only since the 1960's has the world of ceramic art been considered as fine art. Due to its traditional history of serving as only a functional medium to hold liquids and store food items and the like, the ceramic arts have never enjoyed the respect in the art world until very recently. Unlike painting and sculpture, ceramists working creatively in their medium have had to work diligently to prove to art critics and the public that even though the medium they choose to work in is a primitive one, it is still equal to paintings, bronze, or prints for example.

Clay Modern; Finding New Expression in Ceramic Art is the title of this event that will include 11 reputable, international ceramic artists. Here is the list of invited artists:

The event will be held in Gulgong, New South Wales, Australia for one week, 1 May through 7 May 2004. They will be creating their individual works during the week and conducting lectures, demonstrations of their building techniques, glazing formulations, and firing processes including their personal philosophies regarding the current and future in the ceramic arts. Participants will have the opportunity to bring work to be fired and also the occasion to make work. All of the lectures, demonstrations and exhibitions will be open to the participants throughout the week.

2. Ways in which this activity will improve my performance in teaching, creative and scholarly activity, continuing preparation and study, contributions to student growth and development and service to the community and university

This caliber of event is unique because it will be including a vast array of international figures in the contemporary ceramic arts today. Eleven different ceramic artists which within their own countries are professors of art, studio artists or gallery directors. Given the diversity within this event, I know that my teaching philosophies will continue to develop enormously. An event such as this is a chance of a lifetime to connect with figures and compare teaching and strategies for better student success in the classroom. In turn, I will be able and more confident in describing and guiding my students onto graduate programs in the ceramic arts, abroad or within the USA. I also am excited about transferring this particular experience onto our ceramics program at MSU-Mankato and continuing to bring attention to our already strong undergraduate and graduate programs. My aim during the week would also be to establish key contacts with

several of these participating artists that will allow our program to invite them for visiting workshops, exhibitions and lectures at MSU-Mankato. There is also the opportunity to create contacts with persons that are affiliated with art programs around the world, which in turn creates options for our advanced students to further their studies abroad.

Given the amount of international figures who will be attending the event, I will

have a phenomenal opportunity to acquaint myself with them which will in turn, create possibilities of invitations for exhibitions, lectures and workshops. Aside from this, the chance to see eleven different styles of work and techniques in firing will largely influence the way I will look at my own strategies involving the creative process with clay. In short, an event such as this will have huge positive repercussions on my own creative work without question. What I enjoy most about teaching is bringing visuals, experiences and knowledge straight to the students in the classroom. I've seen in their eyes the excitement and energy to follow in my example and work hard to have similar experiences in the ceramic arts. Even though the ceramics world is still slightly behind sculpture and painting as a fine art, one thing ceramists have that they don't is a community that is willing to share information and techniques. I will be taking slides of the event from start to finish that will be used in the classroom. I make sure that students take notes on the individual's work so that one day they may end up meeting the person or coming across their work in a gallery or museum. Along with the experiences and visuals, the student begins to realize just how much opportunity there is in the world today to excel in this particular medium. Finally, as I stated before, I intend to communicate to all students who are willing that there are possibilities to study abroad through the contacts I have developed abroad. These are just a few of the wonderful results I can foresee through participating at this event.

Through this experience I know that I will no longer look the same way at my own work. It will receive changes and modifications. That is the special result that happens through travel whether it be abroad or domestic. It is an essential tool in broadening your creative work. Being new faculty at MSU-Mankato, I am already planning on having a solo or joint show on campus at the Conkling Gallery with my colleague. With this experience, I can also incorporate my experiences attained there and also present a lecture of my travels along with visuals. In short, it would not only enhance the art departments reputation as being diverse, but the universities as well.
