Associate Provost for Undergraduate Education & Student Success, Morehead State University 2016-present (formerly titled Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs)

Morehead State University (MSU) is a comprehensive regional university serving 9,660 students. MSU is ranked #21 among the top public regional universities in the South, offers 141 undergraduate and 70 graduate programs, and has an undergraduate student-to-faculty ratio of 16:1. Approximately 98% of first-time students at MSU receive financial aid, including 52% who receive Pell grants, and more than 30% are first generation college students.

Reporting and major responsibilities: Direct report to Provost & Vice President for Academic Affairs as a principal advisor for academic and personnel matters. Other responsibilities broadly include budget management, strategic plan implementation, student success, review and oversight of academic policies, development/management of the curriculum (e.g., general education, academic programs, and Honors), faculty development, management of high impact practices initiatives (e.g., undergraduate research, education abroad, service learning, internships, and career services), and student academic support services (e.g., advising, tutoring, Registrar, distance education, English as a second language, and international student services). Served as a working member of the President's Senior Cabinet, President's Leadership Council, Deans Council, Strategic Planning Committee, Enrollment Management Team, President's Diversity Council, and the Blue Ribbon Task Force for Regional Empowerment.

- ✓ Spearheaded data-informed changes in student success management that lead to an overall 3.5% increase in first-to-second-year retention, a decrease in excess credits at graduation (-3.8), increased tutoring usage (+18.5% overall, +86% in repeat visits), and increased graduation rates as much as 4.2% (+3% for low-income students and +4.2% underrepresented minority students) over three years.
- ✓ Obtained a \$50,000 grant to create a model of corequisite general education mathematics and writing at MSU, and shepherded efforts leading to more than a 36% increase in completion rates for mathematics and more than a 34% increase in rates of completion for writing by underprepared students across four years.
- ✓ Led a team to redesign the First Year Seminar as a student success course, including instructionally designing a new research-based curriculum about mental health and academic strategies, financial and information literacy, diversity, engagement, and career exploration. First-to-second-year retention rates increased by 9.7% for low income + first-generation students since the redesign.
- ✓ Supported diversity and inclusion on campus by developing a leadership position devoted to minority student success, establishing student services in Spanish for the growing Hispanic student population, sponsoring inclusive teaching workshops for faculty, establishing a re-recruitment campaign for stopped-out minority students, conducting focus groups to discern barriers to underrepresented minority success, spearheading the development of a mentoring program for black male students, and reducing the equity gap by 4.6% for underrepresented minority student retention.
- Improved the compliance practices for assessment of the general education program, especially among dual credit courses, and developed continuous improvement plans through the General Education Council to ensure that the assessment process was meaningful and well supported by faculty.

- Redesigned the summer bridge program to support underprepared and underrepresented minority students, with a 92% success rate among our academically at-risk bridge students and a 100% success rate for underrepresented minority, low income, and first-generation bridge students. The redesign led to a 80% retention rate.
- ✓ Steered a faculty General Education Review Task Force to review and propose faculty-supported changes to the general education program through a two-year process, then led the General Education Implementation Team to plan and launch the revised curriculum for Fall 2021.
- ✓ Facilitated data-informed schedule management to create efficiencies by closing the gap between seat capacities and enrollment in general education, and to increase Winter Session course offerings in by 350% and enrollment by 152% over 5 years. Also redesigned the Intercession term into a longer Maymester and nearly tripled enrollment as a result.
- Co-chaired MSU's Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP), Level UP: Experience Your Future, which was selected as a model QEP by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC). The team identified strategies for embedding high impact practices in *all* academic programs to foster student mastery of each of five key career competencies (i.e., oral and written communication, critical thinking, teamwork, and professionalism), developed and executed assessment plans, trained program faculty, worked with departments to implement the practices into curriculum pathways, and aligned the work of the QEP with the MSU strategic plan. Developed the QEP submission and presentation for SACSCOC with substantial faculty input, and directed the project's budget and communication and marketing plan, and reporting for the QEP.
- ✓ Founded the Center for Career Development & Experiential Education, including developing and recruiting new Coordinator positions to lead four high impact practice areas (i.e., Coordinators of Education Abroad, Undergraduate Research, Service Learning, and Internships) and establishing budgets in each area. The Center fosters career readiness by the scaling of student participation in high impact practices that build critical career skills.
- ✓ Developed, coordinated, and led annual transfer summits with Kentucky Community and Technical College System schools in MSU's service region, producing transfer pathways/agreements for the majority of majors.
- Oversaw the implementation of math pathways for every undergraduate major at MSU, in conjunction with the Department of Mathematics and the Charles A. Dana Center at the University of Texas-Austin, which has increased alignment of math skills to majors substantially over two years.
- ✓ Established standard career and major exploration practices for all MSU students through First Year Seminar.
- Reallocated funds from the staff-led Center for Leadership and Professional Development to create the Faculty Center for Teaching and Learning (FCTL; led by a faculty Director and a team of other faculty Teaching Ambassadors) that now hosts a robust series of professional development workshops and newsletters devoted to teaching and learning issues of all types, teaching-related speakers for convocation-style sessions, and faculty learning communities related to teaching.
- Created and recruited new Degree Completion Coach positions to enhance the graduation rates of students with 75+ hours, and to coordinate re-enrollment campaigns for stopped-out students who are near completion.
- ✓ Developed a best practice-oriented, campus-wide faculty advisor training resource for all colleges, initiated an online advising site for online and regional-campus students, and reorganized the professional Retention & Academic Advising leadership group into areas of at-risk responsibility (e.g., first-generation students, low-income students, underrepresented minority students) to align with the strategic goals of MSU's performance-based funding and diversity plans.
- ✓ Administered the institutional program review process for all academic programs over multiple years and facilitated MSU's adoption of a revised state-wide review process beginning in 2020-21.
- ✓ As part of MSU's SACSCOC Reaffirmation Compliance Team, led efforts to enhance compliance in several academic areas, and authored compliance narratives related to curriculum, academic policies and procedures, faculty credentials, and distance education.
