## Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP), Indiana, PA

IUP is a doctoral, high research activity institution (R2) with an enrollment of more than 9,300 students (headcount). As a comprehensive university, IUP offers 63 bachelor's, 27 master's, and 13 doctoral degree programs in addition to scores of minors, certificates and areas of specialization.

### **College of Education and Communications**

The College of Education and Communications (COEC) is one of five academic colleges housing six academic departments. Approximately 75 permanent and temporary faculty serve more than 900 undergraduate and 600 graduate students. The COEC offers 22 degree and certificate programs, six research and service offices/centers, and supports 14 additional K12/secondary teacher education programs university wide.

## Selected Accomplishments Achieved through Leadership and Collaboration

- Strategically managed budgets and endowments totaling \$14 M, aligning budget to priorities.
- Strived to create a culture of strategic visioning and planning by engaging college leaders in annual priority setting, reporting and ongoing strategic problem solving.
- Led a multi year, college wide major curricular refresh that included the revision of 12 programs, and the development of the following new degree programs: PhD Counselor Education and Supervision, PhD Educational Psychology (conversion from DEd), MA in Instructional Design and Technology, MA in Strategic Communications, and three new certificate programs.

  - Articulated two new 2 2 programs with regional community colleges targeting regional needs in the areas of Special Education and Middle Level STEM.
  - Increased funding for Graduate Assistantships by \$350,000 with partner support.
  - Expanded School University partnerships to include Professional Development Schools to enhance the engagement and diversity experiences of IUP's teacher candidates.
- Established a culture of scholarship in the College.
  - Collaborated with the IUP Research Institute to establish the Principal Investigator's Mentorship Academy (PIMA) at IUP.
  - Modeled successful grantsmanship by securing an additional \$2.8M in externally funded (federal, state, and foundation) grants to support College Diversity and Globalization and Teacher Education.
- Differentiated faculty workload when fiscally possible to highlight individual strengths, and meet unit goals.
- Launched College Research Clusters in the areas of national and regional relevance: teacher residencies, dual enrollment, increasing the number of students with special needs pursuing STEM related careers, international and global initiatives, and diversifying the teaching work force.
- Increased Annual and Major Giving from a new high of \$375,000 in 2014 to \$4.6M in 2020 by working closely with a full time development officer and instituting a College Advancement Council and College Development Plan. Benefits include scores of endowed scholarships and two named centers for research and service: The Bill and Judy Scheeren Literacy Center and the Larry S. Sobotka Science Discovery and Outdoor Learning Center.
- Established a university wide resource, Labyrinth Center, to provide extended services for IUP students with Autism Spectrum Disorder and to train the campus community in working with students with ASD.
- Led overhaul of academic technology for the College, including classroom redesigns and diversifying the technology platforms. The College was poised to pivot to online teaching and learning in response to the pandemic.
